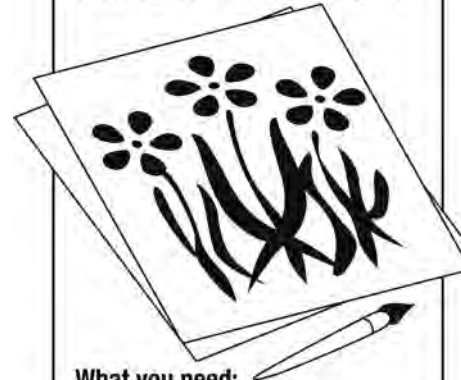

SPRING

Make this beautiful craft to remind you of God's gift of new life at springtime.



What you need:

- White 11" x 17" paper
- Acrylic paint (various spring colors, including green)
- Paintbrush
- Empty two-liter plastic bottle
- Paper plates
- Paper towels

What you do:

1. With the paper placed vertically, paint stems and leaves with green paint.
2. Pour a different color of paint onto a paper plate. Then place the bottom of the bottle into the paint.
3. Using the bottle as a stamp, press it onto the paper to create a flower atop a green stem.

Your fingers and your prayers

1. Start your prayer with your thumb. Give a "thumbs up" to God as a sign of gratitude for the gift of your life. Consider all the good things, which you enjoy, all the people that you love, all the blessings you have. Praise God for them.
2. Extend your index finger. Point in the direction, as best you can, to where those who are special to you may be. Suppose a loved one is in the hospital, or at school taking a test, or at work dealing with the stresses of a job. Try to point toward them and ask God to touch and encourage them as **they deal with life's problems.**
3. Now let your middle and longest finger remind you of those who have the responsibility of leadership — the president and his cabinet, the heads of schools and all teachers, those responsible for running businesses that they may seek the mind of God in all their decision-making, etc.
4. The fourth finger is often the weakest finger. Let it remind you of children, of the disabled, the aged, those who simply cannot care for themselves. Lift up the plight of the weakest members of society to Almighty God that they might find help.
5. Now we come to the smallest finger. It can remind us of our own **personal needs. "If you ... know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give good gifts to those who ask him!"** said Jesus.

So ask, seek, use your hand to knock and see what happens. Remember the advice of the great missionary, William Carey: "Expect great things from God. Attempt great things for God."

Easter sunrise service

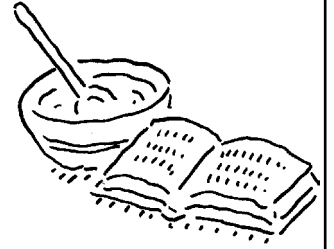

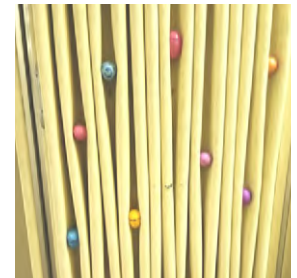

Update from Pastor Francis who serves in Malawi.



Dear Karen,
Lovely Christian greetings from Malawi. I pray that all is well with you and your husband. Above all, the Saints at Wesley Chapel Church. I want you to know that you are such an amazing couple to us here in Malawi and the work we are doing. Your local church, and the friends you talk to about Malawi are so lovely to us. You make differences.

Compassionate Mission Center is a local faith based Non-Governmental organization. You will need to know that all we do depends on donations. It is people like you and your local church which make sure we have life at what we are doing. We do not have a specific month to month donor. People just feel the lead to help.

The orphanage: We have 64 children at our center who must eat 3 times a day, go to school, and live a complete life of basic supplies. There are time we have to live with one meal at a time, not knowing how the next meal for our children will come. Twice or so, you have supported us, come to our aid when we literally had nothing and there, you just showed up from nowhere! That is how we get by here. We simply must trust the Lord TO USE PEOPLE for His work to be done. Evangelism and Church Planting and Leadership trainings - all these cannot be done without people like you getting involved. It pains when we stay for days without going into the villages, more especially the Muslim communities to tell them about Christ.

Hope for Malawi: This is an outreach for boys and girls who dropped out of school. We need to do this. It is the only hope for the future of these children. Some got married, we pull them out of there. Some started working in the farms, or bars, etc. We need to pull them out of there. Yet it is not easy, it is very expensive. Carl has his own children he pays fees for. Yet there is a lot more who need help. In brief, Karen, these boys and girls cannot have their future in full if we cannot help. How about this 18 year old girl we pulled out of a night club where she was employed selling beers and **her body. When I witnessed to her, she accepted Christ and told me, "I am out of there...what's next...bring me back to school."** That's what I'm talking about.

Unusual Answer to a Mother's Prayer

Linda Jo Peters of Terre Haute, Indiana, had her "worry button" pushed when her daughter called from college saying that she was going camping alone in a park in southern Illinois.

Esther, the daughter, said she wanted to spend time alone to sort out what course her life should take in the future. She asked for Bible verses to reflect upon while alone.

Linda knew that Esther felt strongly about her plan. So what was Linda to do? Immediately after the phone conversation, Linda got on her knees and **began what she calls "a dialogue with God." She ended her prayer by saying, "I guess you want me on my knees that weekend." That, of course,** is where she was when the time came.

The morning after Esther spent her first night in camp, she called her mother Linda on a cell phone. Esther said that she was all right and that no one came near where she camped. She reported that all night long a skunk was nearby, circling her tent. Linda wrote later: **"There was no way anyone with evil intent would have approached Esther's tent while the power of prayer in the form of a black-and-white critter was circling it."**
